



To our patrons, friends, and family,

We know COVID-19 is a concern in all our lives. Firstly, we want to thank you for your support and trust as we work with this ever-evolving situation. Secondly, for those that plan to visit Red Bridge Golf Bridge in the upcoming weeks, we want to update you on current protocols and procedures that have been implemented to help protect our staff, our customers and our community:

- We are conducting regular and frequent disinfecting of high-touch areas (including doorknobs, light switches and countertops).
- We are disinfecting and cleaning steering wheels and golf cart keys.
- We are cleaning and disinfecting restrooms multiple times daily
- We are reinforcing illness prevention procedures with all Red Bridge employees as recommended by the medical community, including frequent handwashing, avoiding contact with eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands, and avoiding close contact with people who are sick.
- We are instructing employees who are exhibiting symptoms of illness to stay home or seek care from a medical provider when necessary.
- We care about our customers and instead of shaking hands we have decided to give everyone a tip of the cap or thumbs up as a greeting.

It has been said that being in a wide-open, outdoor space is the least at-risk scenario, but we suggest that taking simple precautions should be part of your pre-shot routine if you plan to play a round of golf.

- Do not golf if you are sick. If you are feeling symptoms related to the virus, just hold off playing golf for now. We don't want to put someone else at risk just to play golf. Get back to the game at a later date.
- Practice "social distancing" by keeping more than six feet away from others. Stay out of gimmie distance on the greens. Avoid prolonged face-to-face discussion on the golf courses. At tee boxes, fairways and greens, keep your distance from groups outside of your own.
- As for the flagstick, despite what you may think about your chances of making a putt, it's probably best to leave the flagsticks untouched for the entire day.

Get in, get out. Only handle your golf bag, golf bag and golf balls. Your playing partners will appreciate the selfishness. If you're playing with friends and family, check that they're feeling well. If you're playing with strangers, keep your social distance. Actions speak louder than words at this time.
